

Otsego Jan. 24th 1860

Respected Brother and Sister I now take this opportunity to inform you of my health which is tolerably good at this time hoping thus time will find you enjoying the same blessing Seth and Verona and Babe are in tolerable health more they were all sick last fall with the ^{yellow} Typhoid fever Brother L and family were well two days ago they have received your letter I was glad to hear from you once more I had wrote several letters but received no answers Lyman and his wife is in Jay county Ind. he has gone down there to preach etc. he's had about 3 weeks preaching the last of Dec. and first of Jan. with some very cold weather for the country there is now two or three inches of snow the weather is pleasant for the season our crops were tolerable good last season we had 167 bushel wheat probably 200 of corn 80 potatoes 25 tons Hay 100 or over of Apples wheat is worth 413, corn 44 etonow we winter 14 head of cattle 2 horses 15 sheep 13 hogs Please give my respects to Daniel and Lydia and tell them to write to me write where Mary lives now the last letter she wrote she was going west Give my respects to Lucy tell her to write to me Likewise Ella and A and all enquiring friends I thought when I was out to see you I should have come and see you before this time but I am growing old and lame and don't know as as I ever shall see you again but hope for the best I have built a house since I was out to see you which cost about \$100, dollars and do not owe a dollar that I know of I have been making preparations to build a Barn soon it may be this summer Seth and Verona are not willing that I should come to see you alone as I am so old and lame
