In the Field Nov. 23rd 1862

Dear Sam

I am still on the banks of the Bayou
Bouf, where I was, when I wrote you last.—
— it is 4^o past 3-o-clock in the morning - last night
was about the coldest night we have had - & I
have stood it as long as I could - told the negro
to make a fire - and I have seated myself to write
you a Letter . Since we came here the Regiment
has been pretty nearly idle - no drill - no in-
spection or any thing of that sort - nothing has
been kept up . except Guard- Mounting - and
dress-parade - the reason for this is because the
officerz are so busy with other matters . The govern-
ment has taken possession of all the private property
in the district lying between where we now are , and
where we were . and nearly every officer who is
considered competent , is hard at work in trying
to get the sugar millz on the different plantations
at work - the cane , which , if it had been ground
earlier , would have made 3 whds . per acre
is now so injured by frost , that it will not
average more than one half that amount . Still
