

Camp Lincoln, Brattleboro' Vt.
Oct. 5th 1862

Dear Laura:

I feel a great deal of anxiety in regard to you, altho' I have heard from you almost every day -

I got a line from Mr. Strickland Sat. night in which he spoke of your health - I hope that you will get along without trouble as I have no doubt you will, but I cannot help feeling troubled about you -

Mary & I have very comfortable quarters - We are but a few rods from camp - Last night I was so tired that I did not go to sleep till after one o'clock. We were mustered in yesterday & shall be paid Monday & be off Tuesday -

Some of the men get leave of absence till tomorrow morning & some will perhaps be at Brattleboro' today

Have some one write often, as soon as you learn where I am to be & I will write longer letters when I get further from home. Yours affectionately
