Nov 3 1868

My dear Wife:

I wrote you a short note last evening, and promised to write again to day if we did not move. So we have not moved I will fulfill my promise, I am glad that my letters prove so interesting to you though I think them rather incipid. We become so used to the incidents that I have to write about that they seem common place to us. The 10th Vr was not engaged in the battle which you mention. but we drawn up in battle line on an eminence which overlooked the battlefield. It has been our fortune to escape all the fighting. I certainly shall have incidents enough to fill volumes to relate at some future day. provided I am spared to relate them.
