Barbara re-asserted Out in the Mountains as a newspaper, held to the standards accepted by other newspapers, and tirelessly promoted that informed writers and sharp, skilled writing are the keys to sustaining a vibrant paper.

The spotlight that shone on Vermont as civil unions slowly and contentiously became reality also directed attention to committed to. 
