** Cathy Voyer served on the House Judiciary
Committee that drafted the civil union law in 2000.
She also supported the law. In 2001, Cathy Voyer
opposed H.502, the bill that would have repealed civil
unions and would have provided benefits to same-sex
couples in a way that erased the similarities between
civil unions and marriage.

However, in 2001 she also voted for
H.404, a divisive "DOMA" bill that would have, for
the fourth time, defined marriage in Vermont as
between a man and a woman—this time in using even
harsher language than before. We remain extremely
disappointed by then-Representative Voyer's vote on
this anti-gay bill. This joint endorsement acknowledges, her role in the crafting and initial passage of
the civil union law.
