Democracy Project Yields Results

The Gill Foundation's Democracy

Project is a non-partisan, non-ideological effort to increase participation in the democratic process. The project's primary goal is to help state-level organizations serving the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) community build a voter file of people who support LGBT equality – regardless of their own sexual orientation or gender identity. The multi-year project involves list enhancement and specialized training within selected states to assist LGBT organizations'GOTV (get-out-the-vote) efforts.

The Democracy Project piloted the list enhancement program

in seven states in 2002. Those states were New Hampshire, Vermont, Georgia, Florida, Missouri, Colorado, and Oregon. The seven additional states chosen for inclusion in 2003 are lowa, Ohio, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, North Carolina and Washington State. The goal is to maximize democratic participation by members of stakeholder organizations and their households.

The Democracy Project held its 2nd annual training session on September 10 in Winooski. Seven Vermont LGBT organizations are participating in the project for the
