

At its March 5th meeting, the Board of Directors of the Vermont Freedom to Marry Task Force welcomed five new directors. The Task Force is currently supplementing its work promoting same-sex marriage in Vermont with active support of the Gender Identity Bill before the state legislature.

In addition, in
February the Task Force
filed a "friend of the court"
brief in the Washington
Supreme Court. Like the
briefs the Task Force submitted in Oregon and
Massachusetts marriage

cases, the brief argues that civil unions are not fully equal, and don't meet the constitutional requirement of non-discrimination. Only full marriage equality does.
