
MAX MARTINI'S CD REVIEWS

After you hear Allison Tartalia's Ready, you'll not be surprised at the adjectives being used to describe her: powerful, expressive, quirky, sultry, more jazzy than folky, and edgy. Not only is Allison an amazing singer/performer, she has an extraordinary and original flair for songwriting. Allison received the 2003 Outmusic Award for **Outstanding Debut Recording** Female and was nominated for

Outstanding Producer.

Looking to expand your world music CD collection? If so you might give this a spin. The CD is a fusion of African musical styles including Afrobeat, Calypso, Highlife, Juju, Soca, Toasting, and Zouk. "Africanism III" is definitely a commendable homage to some of the best African musicians on the planet and will make you want 'Zookey" (lift your leg up). 1 Martini

If you're looking for something that makes you hot, wet, and keeps you pumped up, this is for you. This is high-powered tribal dance music with drums, diva anthems, and more drums. The continuous mix captures your attention from the start with Michael C's "Feelings" and closes with Paulo's previously unreleased mix of Shelia Brody's "U Ain't That Good" - leaving you exhausted but satisfied. Max's Take: You'll recognize many of the pieces on this CD - Rene's fourth on his own label - and there is a good mix of the classical ("Claire de Lune"), movie ("Somewhere in Time"), Broadway ("The Music of the Night"), and traditional ("Amazing Grace"). Rene's original arrangements ("Love for all Seasons" and "Anam Cara" (soulmates)) are creative and seamlessly woven into the other pieces. This is definitely mood music for all those romantics out there. If it sounds like shmaltz to you, give it a pass. 2 Martinis


If you are into the House music scene, "Twilight Trax" has a good mix of the classics (Mr. Fingers' "Can You Feel It" and Ron Hardy's "Liquid Love"), along with previously unreleased grooves (Screamin' Rachel's "Just Want to Make Love" and Master C&J's "It Will Make You Happy"). Slide it into your CD player at your next cocktail party (rooftop optional) or if you're like-Max – for your long commute. 2 **Martinis**

Parisian producer, Bob Sinclar (Yellow Productions Recordings), and Tommy Boy Entertainment are introducing North America to Salome de Bahia in August 2005. From the Bahia region of Brazil, Salome de Bahia has been making records since 1958 and was the star of Brazil Tropical - a musical review, which featured forty musicians, singers, and dancers led by bandleader Edvaldo Carneiro. As interesting as hearing "Copacabana" is, this CD won't be appealing to everyone. **3** Martinis ▼
