The figure on the lithograph is a very good one if the shield should not be charged with St George's cross, and would appear well with the American crest below by his side. - But I have given no thought to the subject, hoping that I should see you before any demand should be made for the design - and now I do not think it of any importance that it should be furnished forthwith.
