

Woodstock Dec. 23. 1857

Dear Sir,

I have been much occupied by Court business since the receipt of yours of the 18th and have not, until this day, since conferring with Judge Porter, had time to write.

We must leave the ordering of the figures to summarize the donee to you, as we are not likely to meet, as a committee.
