

Boston Apr. 14. 1858
Mr. Marsh.

The doctor arrived in Boston yesterday, and booked his name at the Quincy House (where I board) He usually stops here. As yet I have not seen him, but presume I shall soon. I wrote to you from Montpelier or somewhere on the way home, in regard to an architect by the name of Richards who was at Mt. at the time the commissioners were deciding in regard to the design.
