

Boston July 27<sup>th</sup> 1858  
My Friend Marsh,

I hear nothing as yet from Powers or his done, but am in hopes that he will be influenced by you to keep where he is, if nothing more. I am highly convinced, of the great service you have it in your power to render by refraining to endorse anything but the original. The responsibility is so great touching this donee question, that ~~He~~ is in much trouble, and wishes for some one of standing to be with him aside from being in utter ignorance of how to lay that work out, as it should be, and aided in their dilemma by an original desire to amend, they are now, in a new and peatfull darkness.  
I had made my drawings (and have with me copies) so as to have the big trusses land 18" in the side walls, and then I had designed and shown in the drawings to have the brick walls put out eight or ten inches more with a flat stone for a bearing on the top of all, now as incredile as it may seem that ignorance of a Richards has made a mistake in his new figuring and the trusses in some instances land only 12 $\frac{3}{4}$ " in all and at most but 16". The putting out I am cheated out of. Now they have
