Dear Wife

I have just got relieved from guard and will now write you a short letter that you may know I am still well and have not forgotten my friends. This is a lovely day much unlike what we have had for a number of days past and I presume different from the weather you are having in Vermont. I am looking for a letter from you to day and expect to hear you are ready to go to Sanby, but I fear you will not see much of this country this year, it is getting so late but perhaps you will enjoy a visit full as well later after the mud gets dried up so you can get around better. I am afraid we will not get paid off soon enough, so I can furnish you with funds to go with but you can speak to N. A. Sasulo and see if he is willing to let you have 25, or 40 - if so you will not be obliged to wait for my pay. There is some talk of our leaving here before
