

Boliver, Va., Sept 29th 1862

Head, Quarters. 34th, regt, co. F.

dear Sister

after a long time I get an opportunity of penning a few lines to let you know that I am yet alive but not in the best of spirits we have had a great deal of marching since we left Harisons Landing we marched down the peninsula to New Point News and then took the boat and came to Hampton Alexandria and then marched to Chain bridge and from that to Centre Hill and covered the retreat of Popes army back to Chain bridge we then went into Maryland and up the Potomac to where the great fighting was we did not have to fight in the ^{tains} moon but we had it hot enough at Sharpsburgh there we lost Chester Roads killed second Lieut Hill killed George Beers wounded George Waldron wounded H Govenor wounded L Sawyer wounded O Bigelow wounded H Green wounded B Hemmitt slightly first Lieut prisoner corporal Penn prisoner we then marched to Harpers Ferry and crossed the river onto Boliver heights at which place we remain I do not know how long we shall stay here but I hope we shall stay here all winter for I have got sick of marching I got a letter from Hiram he was at Hampton and was not very well I have not heard from
