3 miles below Warrenton Junction
May 5th 1863 - Va

Dear Mary:

I wrote you a letter yesterday
& directed it to Charlestown but for fear that
you may have left there I will write a line &
direct to Bradford. You will see by this, as
you have probably learned before that we have
moved at last. We left camp at Wolf Run
the morning of May 2^d. & camped here the same
night. I remained with eight Cos. of the Regt
at this place, Maj. Kingley had two at
Cathlet's Station & Col. Blunt returned to
Union Mills the first night. We had a
little excitement the next morning of which I
have written the particulars in my other
letter. I am pretty well tho' it is pretty hot.
I have a floor to my tent & am as comfortable
as can be. Nelson is not well yet but I
hope will not have a fever -

Contrabands are coming in here all the time -
They & the white refugees all tell the same
