

Camp of 12th Vermont Vol. M.
Union Mills, Va
June 10th 1863.

My Dear Mary:

Wednesday -

Your kind letter of Friday
June 5th was received tonight after waiting
two long days without a letter. How much good
so kind and affectionate and gentle a letter did
me in reply to my foolish letter, that I almost
fear'd would offend you. I am so glad to hear
from you & I will try & be as good & firm as
your true love deserves -

You see we are still at Union Mills and
think now we shall stay here the rest of our
time. We shall probably leave here before the
close of this month - so that when this letter
reaches you there will be only about fifteen
days more for us to stay here.

Tattoo has just been beaten - and a
train is now coming in that has been expected
for several hours from Rappahannock with
prisoners. Stuart was intending to make a
raid & Genl. Pleasanton crossed over at
Brookly's Ford, where we were a few days
ago, and attacked Stuart before he left
camp yesterday. The fighting lasted almost
