

Camp of 12th Vt. V. M.
1/2 Miles beyond Centerville
June 25th 1863

My Dear Wife:

Your kind letter of
last Sunday, June 21st, was rec'd ~~to~~
day after we reached Union Mills -
We left the depot at seven o'clock this
morning & reached the Mills before
ten. We waited there until after three
for the 10th to come up & then the whole
brigade took up the line of march for
Centerville. We passed thro' that place &
are now in camp about a mile to half
north of it. It commenced raining before
we got to camp & has rained ever
since. We have got comfortable & had supper.
The Chaplain tent with me. We shall
yet play well together I hope.

We are to move again in the morning
at seven o'clock towards Edwards Ferry -
We are to stop at Guilford Station on the
London & Hampshire R.R. about 27 miles
from Washington or rather Alexandria. We shall
not be far from where Lee is - I
will see him if I can.

P.S. The 10th has moved to Edwards Ferry -
