

Camp of 12th W. V. U -
Near Adams Town, Md -
On the road to Hagerstown -
June 28th 1863 -

My Dear Wife:

Sunday 9 o'clock
P.M.

I mailed a letter to you
this morning at Potosi where we camped
last night, but fearing that you may not
get it I write you again tonight -

We are now encamped not far
from Point of Rocks on the Potomac. We have
crossed the Baltimore & Ohio R. R. & are on
the road that passes thro' Middletown
to Hagerstown - We shall go a little West of
Frederick. This is the end of our fourth
day's march and the men are suffering
terribly from sore feet & exhaustion -

We left Wolf Run Shoals last Thursday &
marched to a mile beyond Centerville -
where we went into camp late at night
in the rain. We left there at 8 o'clock in the
morning and marched to Herndon Station
on the Loudon & Hampshire R. R. in Va.
where we went into camp at 8 o'clock P.M.
The next morning - Saturday - we left camp
at 5 & crossing at Edwards Ferry, camped
