My Darling Mary Jane

You see by
the head of this letter that we have
changed our "base" slightly since
I wrote you last. We received orders
last Wednesday about noon to move
at once to Harpers Ferry - we packed up
every thing and moved that night to
mouth of the Monocacy and camped.
Mrs Lunde and her daughters gave us
that were acquainted (Capt Frost & Dr
Rutherford and Chaplain Hayes), a
good supper, a good bed, and a good
breakfast, and when we left in the
morning I took the liberty of kissing all
the girls a "good by" and the old lady
wished us good luck and made me
a present of a bottle of Whiskey. Now
don't you think they were very good friends?
