miles from Stafford
Court House, ten or twelve
from the Landing on the Patow-
mack, and eleven from Freder-
icksburgh. Thursday morning, Nov.
20. 1862.

Dear Home, I did not
succeed in sending this
as I expected at the time of
writing and have had
no opportunity since.
We marched the next
morning as I expected,
crossing the railroad at
Cattlett's Station, camping
for the night some ^{two or three} miles
this side, ~~made~~ again
early Monday morning
and again Tuesday. Since
Tuesday P.M. we have
been in camp here in
