I shall long awake nights thinking of the little fellow. I write tonight on the impulse which your letter gave me for I was feeling sickly tonigh not homesick that does trouble me at all but yesterday morning I went on Picket at six and came in that morning at eleven Picketing in favorable weather its bad enough but on this occasion it rained all the night before and all Day. which in addition to wind occasioned by the frost in the ground caused an amount of mud that would surprise a turner.
