

White Ford Md. March 18<sup>th</sup> 1863

My dear wife -

I arrived here yesterday  
(Tuesday) safe and sound. I was attacked  
with a very severe headache soon after I left  
N. York and it lasted me until I reached  
Point of Rocks. Which was at 12 M. and got I  
got here about 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  P.M. They are all glad  
to see me I can tell you. and I was glad to  
see them. I came very near missing the train at  
Baltimore I met with nothing of interest on the  
road - but I did not see any bear ground till  
I arrived at Point of Rocks. The mountains all  
around us last night was covered with snow  
but today there is not a sight to be seen.  
My friends here say that it has been very cold  
here ever since I left. I lost my trunk at  
Point of Rocks. They did not put it off the  
train, but I told the R.R. Agent that it  
must be returned to day - and I have sent a  
man up after it. I found John at the  
Station waiting for me. Which you may believe  
was very agreeable to me.  
To day I have been to Potville to see Col. Jewett  
and he was very glad to see me also Dr. Childe
