Saturday ^{Apr} 11th 1863

I wrote a long history of our day
adventures last night - and therefore I have
nothing new to write this evening - We
are having delightful summer weather -
and every one seems to enjoy it and your
humble servant with the rest.

If this weather continues we shall move to
Poolville the first of next week. Then we
will have work enough to do for a week or
ten days fitting up our camp again. The
probabilities are that we shall stay here this
summer, and I can tell you that we
heartily desire it for a pleasant place
could not be found. Speaking of Poolville
reminds me of a question you asked
in your letter - about that man sen-
tenced to be hung - His name is
Plasants, the sentence has been changed
by the President to imprisonment and
hard labor during the war. When I
got back from it I found our Hospital
Steward under arrest for stealing from
the dead at Offutt's cross road last Dec
