Camp at Union Mills Va.

March 29th 1863

Dear Sister -

I rec^d your letter of
Mon 24th this P.M. & as I have
nothing else to do (you know we are
generally very busy) will answer this
evening. — We have got our tent
fixed up so we are as comfortable

as when we were at the other camp
We have a good board floor &
a stove, & our bunks are better
than we ever had them before.
At the other camp we had them
made of small poles laid on
crotches drove in the ground, two
lower ones, & two upper ones so
you see they took up no more
room than two would anyway
being one above the other like
bunks in a steamboat. This time
we took the fly to one of our tents
& stretched it across the outside
poles & it is as easy to sleep
