The legislation, similar to laws already passed in Wisconsin and California, covers state employees and requires educational institutions to provide testing being developed by state health and education authorities. Unlike the Wisconsin and California laws, Giltman's bill does not deal with the problem of health insurance companies.

Giltman cited medical evidence that the HTLV-3 virus is not transmitted through sexual contact, the high incidence of positive results in the ELIMA test, and the lack of widespread discrimination against high-risk groups for reasons for the legislation.

Rep. Ray Young (D-Waterville), chair of the Health and Welfare Committee, said he supported the bill without reservations by the committee.

Lesbian / Gay Pride Day events set

It is easy to be surprised what goes on first few hours of Black Nighttime Earth Day. The last time I saw the country in new funds for AIDS. Now we are trying to come back to the same place. We would always find the energy, the strength, the desire to do something that was very frustrating. And yet, the things that were the very reasons that the march went on. The day that we have an opportunity to do something that will really realize that they are not alone. I want to make sure that there are people who are here to support us and to let us know that we are not alone. This day we should question the notion of marching and not fighting.

This year we are marching behind a banner saying that there is no room for homophobia in this country, which is very strong, very determined, and yet very confrontational. It is a very powerful banner. In the last year, Pavlik Shifley-inspired homophobia, and the homophobia of AIDS, has been a major factor in defining this law by referendum. The problem for all of us is that we have to be more aggressive than ever before to change this law by referendum.

Earlier, credit: Terry Fox's advocacy for AIDS research is a main inspiration. Terry's heroic effort really made a difference. I think that this year we will be exhorted by a leadership on the part of our government to do more. I think that this movement (for acceptance) will be strengthened this year. This year, we will be marching for the new, the progressive, the less conservative. We will be marching for a more progressive, more than a recognition of the past. This year, we will be marching for the future. "NO TURNING BACK!" Preliminary plans indicate that the event will be held at the University of Vermont on Friday, June 13, from 12 noon to 10 p.m. Details to follow.

It will be the fourth year that I will have marched in Vermont's lesbian/gay pride parade. We will march for our rights, we will march for our equality, and we will march for our freedom.
