Saturday afternoon, a second worship service was held, followed by the keynor speech at 1:30 by Ellie Haney. Dr. Hane is a feminist and spiritualist leader, from the Bath (ME) area, with a Ph.D. in ethic from Yale. She founded a Maine group to free women from patriarchy. She spoke about our need to change ourselves and to release ourselves from patterns that don fit. The challenge in life, Ms. Haney stated is to bring out the true spiritual self the dwells inside and shed roles and attitude learned in one's upbringing.

Saturday afternoon included monworkshops and discussion of the results of a national survey of UU members' attitude towards gay rights. Saturday evening samuch sharing and fellowship.

Sunday's events included the regular worship service, Chas provided great music. Especially moving was a male due from opposite ends of the choir loft; it was a love song, to each other and to the congregation, and it brought tears and unprecedented applause.

Keith Kron, participant from Kentucky, made a strong pitch to hold new year's convocation at his church in Lexington. He came armed with pamphlets and even a written endorsement from his church and his minister!


