Answers to Trivia

Who: Donald Webster Cory (pseud). His book, published in 1951, applied civil rights ideas to the case of homosexuals.

What: "The Woman-Identified Woman." This work was the collective product of lesbians pioneering to unite their sisters from the gay movement and from the women's movement into one body. Rita Mae Brown initiated this action after resigning from NOW in 1969.

Where: Battery Park, New York City. At this feminist rally, during Women's Liberty Action Week, O'Leary expressed solid anti-male stance and made a call for women-identified lifestyles. Her radical views and high visibility created much controversy within the Lesbian and Gay Rights groups she was active in at the time.

When: May 1971. This Gay Activist Alliance newsletter was started to help unify gay subcultures into a cohesive community. More importantly, it was meant to enhance unity among the cultural and political forces who were in conflictate the time by improving communication.
