give a boost to the fight for federal gay ights legislation. In the Congress, H.R. 655, filed January 24, 1989, would amend the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Fair Housing Act to prohibit discrimination based on sexual and affectional preference. The bill has nine sponsors in the Senate and 11 co-sponsors in the House.

"Gay civil rights is perhaps the last rontier of the great civil rights struggles of he twentieth century," continued LaFonaine of the Coalition. "A community that as been silent and invisible is rapidly ransforming itself into a surging political orce. The dream we've realized here in lassachusetts may be echoed in state after rate in the very near future."


