Today a friend in Chittenden County died of AIDS. He died earlier than he should have since he ignored doctor's orders of plenty of sleep, little to no alcohol, moderate exercise, proper nutrition, and stress management counseling and techniques.

We had not talked much lately. The last time we spoke, he bragged about unsafe sex with one-night stands from Pearls, the Loop, and Montreal. Several "tricks" were married, both gay and straight. On a few

occasions he told guys after unsafe sex that he had AIDS. Needless to say, our last conversation was heated.

I applaud *OITM* for its efforts to educate the public on ways to increase the body's resistance and immune system and ways to fight the onset of AIDS. Being "out in the mountains" does not isolate us from this illness. My now dead friend has probably infected a dozen people in the area.

I can't grieve. I'm too angry.
