April 14th was the initial meeting of Vermont's first (as far as we know) lesbian educators' network and support group. Those present shared what it is like to be a lesbian in a public school setting. They discovered the degree to which each of them was "out" in school and offered support for the individual decisions each person makes. The women expressed their feelings of isolation and of apprehension at the risks involved in working in this setting. Sharing their stories was a powerful expe-

rience and one we hope will strengthen our connections.

Creating Change Conference Planned

Lesbian and gay organizers from around the nation will converge on Alexandria, VA, this November 9-12 for the 4th Annual Creating Change conference of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force (NGLTF). Creating Change is the country's largest skills-building symposium for gay and lesbian political activists and organizations.

The conference, sponsored annually by NGLTF, will feature more than 60 workshops, as well as cultural events, caucuses, networking sessions, leading activists from the national and grassroots scene and some of the most electrifying, provocative speakers in the lesbian and gay movement.

This year, Creating Change will be augmented by three extra-conference institutes. On November 8, "People of Color Organizing Institute" will address such topics as networking strategies, women of color issues and coalition building among the Black, Latin, Native American, and Asian communities. Also on November 8, the "Diversity Training Institute" will explore the broad spectrum of the gay and lesbian community and investigate ways of building a more inclusive movement. Following

the conference, on November 12, the "Campus Organizing Institute" will provide an opportunity for students to reinforce their organizing skills and learn more about the range of issues facing lesbians and gay men in college communities.
