Quilt Comes to Dartmouth College

The Names Project's AIDS Memorial Quilt will be close to Vermonters on May 17,18, & 19 in Hanover, NH. The AIDS Community Resource Network of the Upper Valley(ACoRN) is sponsoring the

three-day display at Dartmouth College's Thompson Arena.

Cleve Jones, founder of The Quilt, and Jonathan Mann, founder and former Director of the Global Program on AIDS of the World Health Organization, will be on hand to welcome The Quilt as well as participate in

other AIDS-related activities. All events

are open to the public.

The Quilt is being brought to Dartmouth as part of the College's observance of AIDS Awareness Week (May 13-19). Included in the week's activities will be an evening of dramatic readings on Monday night (3 Rockefeller Center, 7 p.m.), a panel on "The Ethical Issues of AIDS" on Tuesday (Chilcott Auditorium, noon-1:30 p.m.), and a lecture by Jonathan Mann entitled "AIDS: An International Perspective" at noon on Wednesday (Chilcott). On

Wednesday evening, Cleve Jones will join Mann for a discussion on "AIDS: Personal Response/Public Responsibility" (Webster Hall, 7 p.m.).

On Thursday, Drs. David and Beverlie Sloane will present "The AIDS Quilt:


Weaving Together American Memories (105 Dartmouth Hall, 7 p.m.). A panel discussion with Jones and others living with HIV will also be held.

The Quilt will be unfolded on Friday, May 17, following a ceremony at 10:30 a.m. led by Jones. The Quilt will remain on display at Thompson

Arena on Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., and on Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5

p.m.

On Saturday evening, the Academy Awardwinning documentary *Common Threads* will be shown at 7:00 and 9:30 p.m. in Loew Auditorium.
