



#### In Memoriam Helen L. Hutchins McHenry

Helen L. Hutchins McHenry died Friday evening June 14, 1991 at home in Burlington with family and friends. Helen, who was 56 years old, died following a year-long battle with breast cancer, which she characteristically fought with courage, dignity, sass, and spite.

Helen was born May 1, 1935 in Freeport, Illinois, the daughter of William and Mary (Thomson) Hutchins. She graduated from Wooster College in Wooster, Ohio, did graduate work for two years at the University of Chicago, and earned a master's degree in counseling at the University of Vermont.
