I've been reading Odd Girls & Twilight Lovers, Lillian Faderman's history of lesbian life in twentieth century America. In addition to being a fascinating and revealing social history, Faderman's book highlights the great diversity of lesbian lives.

OITM similarly celebrates the diversity of our community. In this issue alone you can read about gays and lesbians who are Pentacostals, publishers, Episcopalians, parents, professors, Jews. A review of the Resource Page shows the variety of organizations we are involved in. From lesbians and gays who loudly proclaim their identity to those (as in the letter from Moira) who lead more quiet lives, we are everywhere.

Another view of lesbian and gay lives is reported in the articles about eastern Europe. Despite repression and fear much worse than ever experienced by most of us in western countries, the first ever gay and lesbian rights and AIDS conference was held in Leningrad and Moscow at the end of July. For four days, participants from the U.S. and the Soviet Union met in workshops, attended films, and held public demonstrations, including the distribution of condoms.

Next month, on National Coming Out Day, October 11th, we celebrate in a very public way, that which we live every day. For a preview of activities in Vermont read the Coming Out Day article in this issue. The October issue of *OITM*, our annual Coming Out issue, will have more information on activities, along with articles, book reviews, coming out stories and a bibliography.
