With the anti-discrimination bill having been formally introduced into the legislature, its course might now seem somewhat confusing.

The bill had its "first reading" in January 1991 and was assigned to the Judiciary Committee for consideration. Judiciary Committee members will decide what priority to give th anti-discrimination bill and what action to take. Since the Governor's agenda in '91 was the advocacy of "traditional" crime bills (that is, bail,
