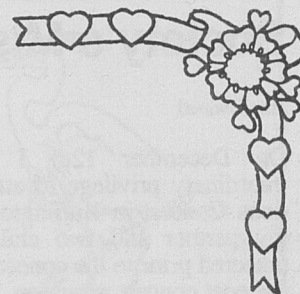


signed from the Air Force after over ten years of service. Noting that his resignation was unrelated to his sexuality, Rob remains guardedly optimistic about Clinton's promise. Citing problems with racism and sexism in the military, Rob explained that problems with rescinding the ban are inevitable and notes that "views cannot be changed overnight". However, tied to the development of administrative actions to deal with anti-gay episodes, Rob concludes that over time, rescinding the ban will be "no big deal".

The question for Vermonters appears to be not whether President Clinton will rescind the Pentagon's ban but when will he do it. If action is not taken by April 25, 1993, President Clinton will have some answering to do when an estimated 500,000 gay, lesbian, and bisexual Americans march on Washington demanding that he keep his word and quickly put an end to Pentagon witch hunts. ▼
