've been busy visiting the many sites that readers have given me the URL's for and I am excited by the diversity and creativity I've seen so far. It is also exciting to see Vermont's GLBT community take advantage of the web and its capabilities. The following are a few of the sites that have come to may attention.

The newest site (39 visitors so far and growing) is the one for Lavender Productions, Inc.

(http:// homepages. together.net/ ~lavender), the organization behind the cable access program The Vermont

Rainbow Connection. Since February of this year, this half-hour program has reached the GLBT community through several cable outlets in northern Vermont. Comprised of both news and interviews, The Vermont Rainbow Connection seeks to inform viewers of the many resources available to the Vermont GLBT community. The web page features lists of days and times you can watch the program and past and future guests. It also offers an opportunity for groups and individuals to be a "Rainbow" sponsor. My favorite part of the site is the old television set that flashes both a Rainbow Connection logo and a photograph of the co-anchors, Barry Mitchell and Sharon Randall.

Another cable access regular, Yolanda, has a web site that's every bit as flamboyant as the diva herself. Called "Yolanda CyberWorld" (http:/ /www.sover.net/~asp/y/top.htm), it is hosted by Crotchie (the name says it all) who takes the visitor on a wild romp through the site. The graphics are great and so are the sound clips of Yolanda's band The Plastic Family. You can read Yolanda's work in progress, under "The Script," as well as press releases and press clippings.
